We are halfway through Lent and each Sunday the gospel demonstrates how Christ is becoming more and more well known among the Jewish population. His many miracles and explanations are converting the crowds to His way. However, all of that will change shortly. People who have accepted Him now will reject Him and reject Him with force. We see how fickle humanity is in embracing Jesus one moment and pushing Him away the next. We see our own fickleness in the Gospel. How many times have we embraced Christ with joy and good feeling only to reject him when our choices become difficult? During Holy Week we see all of the darkness of humanity displayed. It is as if the Holy Spirit puts all our weaknesses in one time frame for us to look at! I find it very humbling to put myself in the crowds or with the apostles during Holy Week. When I ask myself how I would have reacted or behaved in the unfolding chaos I am not always happy with the answer.

It is said that Lent and Holy Week are a journey each of us takes to Easter. How we make that journey is determined by our intensely personal relationship with Christ. No two journeys will be the same. Each of us will carry a cross and each of us will climb a Calvary but the promise of Resurrection and salvation is real and Easter joyously celebrates that. The beautiful prayer of St. Francis said at Stations of the Cross, "We adore you O Christ and we bless you because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world" underscores the reality of our own suffering and redemption.

Easter is our hope and our joy. It is the antidote to our suffering and gives meaning to our cross through His cross. The ending phrase of the Exultet, the joyous Easter Proclamation said at the opening of the Easter Vigil service sums this up beautifully:

*May the morning Star which never sets
find this flame still burning:*

*Christ, that Morning Star, who came back from the dead,
and shed his peaceful light on us all,
your Son who lives and reigns for ever and ever.*

May God grant us a prayerful Holy Week, a joyous Easter and peace on earth.
