Living our Franciscan Values - Bea Sandford, Secretary

Because of the challenges of belonging to a fraternity that covers a large geographic area, our fraternity has been unable to come up with an apostolate that will allow all members to participate. Therefore, our members are living their Franciscan values with apostolates he or she can do on their own.

One of the apostolates that brings me great joy is the JOY Ministry at Saint Bede Catholic Church. I lead a team of JOY Ministers who visit the Verena at the Reserve, a retirement community in York County. There are a dozen Catholics who are unable to easily attend Mass and before COVID-19, our team members visited these men and women once a week to bring them the Eucharist. Our world changed in mid-March in response to this highly contagious disease that can be lethal to those over 65 years so we are unable to visit our friends. After dividing the residents into manageable numbers for each team member, I reached out to five of the residents; two couples and one lady who never married, to see if they would like to receive a call each week for spiritual Communion. The two couples who have each other for company declined my invitation. However, Betty B accepted my invitation and asked if I would be willing to call her daily. The residents at the Verena are confined to their rooms so my call to Betty provides her with an opportunity to stay connected and assure her that someone is making sure she is okay. Our relationship has deepened as a result of these daily calls and I am getting to know someone more deeply than I would have thought possible before this lockdown.
